Therein, they were inspired to start an African religious missionary congregation of the Apostles of Jesus, which would continue to evangelize the African continent and the world. There at the foot of Mt. Moroto the Apostles of Jesus was born with a seminary and novitiate. Today, these founders are the men the founder of Rubanda Solidarity, Fr. Dominic Tumusiime, AJ, wishes to attribute all his blessings and his ministry. Fr. Tumusiime considers the two missionaries as his religious parents and directly connected to the work of his hands, the Rubanda Solidarity School. For Father truly believes their spiritual intercession in heaven continues to influence the goodness of their missionary work. Just to remind you dear reader, these two missionaries have a divine miracle attached to their death. Despite their death occurring twenty years apart, they both died on the same day of 27th and same month of July. Thus, making it easier for us to celebrate their life, legacy, and death anniversaries together on the same day. Allow me to mention, they are also both buried in the same tomb in the Chapel of our Major seminary in Langa'ta, Nairobi, Kenya following their last wills. Let us always be humble to learn from our past mistakes, allow God to use us as He wills and move on, more determined for a better tomorrow. INTERVIEW WITH THE SCHOOL DIRECTOR

Here comes Asiimwe Innocent and Ventina Twinamasiko meeting the director Fr. Dominic.

"A knock at the door"

Inno and Ventina: Good morning, Father

Fr. Dominic: Good morning, Staff..... laughs

Inno and Ventina: We are editors of Rubanda Solidarity school magazine 2022 and we

are requesting to have an interview with you.

Fr. Dominic: Oh, I appreciate that noble cause, please be seated!

Inno and Ventina: When did you get a vision of starting this great school?

Fr. Dominic: Aah... many years ago. It was during my missionary service years in southern highlands of Ethiopia, during the peak of HIV/AIDS virus. Arriving home for my vacation, I noticed increasing numbers of students dropping out of the only existing government primary day schools. Rubanda West had no single private school then. That meant there were no private schools, no boarding school, and no meals served during school times. Remember, schools were long distances far from most homes and many students walked for miles to get to school from Monday to Friday on empty stomachs. With this happening, I decided to do something to make a difference. During my home vacation of 2004, I graciously met Sr. Stella working as a Deputy and Mrs. Ssebugwaho Ntegyereze as a headteacher of Rubanda Mixed Primary school. With Sr. Kyasiimiire we agreed to launch a study program to find and confirm reasons for the increasing drop out and the school administration gave us permission to use their premises. After a year of study, the results confirmed food as the main cause. And so, we began the first Nursery and Primary School in Rubanda West that was day and boarding in 2005.

Inno and Ventina: (surprised eee...) That was great! Rubanda Solidarity School is known to be among the leading schools in Uganda, how have you managed to climb that ladder?

Fr. Dominic: This is by several factors: by the results of the previous unpublished research, clear vision, great mission and child/student focused objectives and putting our foundation on the 3 Pillars of Faith, Academics and Life Skills. The name of our school too is very attractive and embodies the values we stand for like Unity is power and "Get United for Success". All these reinforce each another for good performance and excellence. Our emphasis is on teamwork, community involvement and building of in and out partnerships which have become our backbone for our growth, expansion, and future sustainability. We strongly believe in the Kiga proverb that it's the combination of two teeth that shatters a bone.

Inno and Ventina: (smile) How did you feel when the PLE results were released for the first time, and you found Rubanda Solidarity with 19/21 candidates of 2012 in first grade?

Fr. Dominic: (Laughs......) Ooh, after the UPLE national results and all our candidates had passed with distinguished excellence, I ran to my room, picked the New American Bible to search for the real words of the song of the Psalmist. I immediately found it, "Those who sow in tears will reap with cries of joy", Psalm 126: 5.

Inno and Ventina: By the way, how old is Rubanda Solidarity School?

Fr. Dominic: Hahaha, we turned adult youth this year, 18 years old study year inclusive. We can now drive, and the skies are no longer our limit.

Inno and Ventina: We know you are a missionary priest who moves wherever you are sent, how do you manage to lead the school when you are not there always?

Fr. Dominic: aah, I love this. The Kiga proverb has it that where there is the heart there are the early morning legs. I also believe strongly in the common experience that when you do something with a passion it stops being a job. These two elements guide me and pull me in with a conviction that I have two related missions: one by the obligation of my religious life and discipline; and the other by walking extra miles in sharing my energies and opportunities to share and contribute to the needs of people who cannot do it themselves. To serve and make a difference, I rely on the providence of God. I know God is rich and can give anything out of love for love. He has always fulfilled his promise. He gives me rightful people to team up with me as administrator on the grounds, friends to join hands in both materially and intellectually to keep our noble work.

Inno and Ventina: Father, you have taught us to be focused and disciplined to have a bright future; how do you normally feel when suspending a worker or a student due to indiscipline?

Fr. Dominic: It always takes time and patience to suspend a staff member. But once I see that my patience is not helpful and instead it is becoming a hazard for the life and performance of the school and the values we stand for, I have no choice but take a painful decision. For that we have put our Constitution and Personnel Manual in place and encourage each staff member to study it and be conversant with it to protect that good relationship between the employer and employee.

Inno and Ventina: Thank you very much Fr. Dominic for your time. See you in the next release of the solidarity school magazine.

Fr. Dominic: (smiles) Thank you, my dears and God bless you!

A WORD FROM THE NUSERY SECTION MOTHER

I am Teacher Kesande Joy, the deputy in charge of Nursery section. I want to start by thanking God who has enabled us to reach on this special school day. Rubanda Solidarity Nursery School is composed of day and boarding students for both boys and girls. It was started by Rev. Fr. Dominic Tumusiime assisted by Sr. Stellamaris and Mr. Rogers Orishaba. His vision was to support especially the vulnerable children and families to have "Better Life". In order to achieve this for children and society was to offer the children and the community means to "Quality Education".

Before founding Rubanda Solidarity, Father organized a study year to find out why students were not interested in the only existing government aided schools and why there were high dropouts. His one year experiment had 72 students who spent it under a tree but with exceptional breakfast after assembly and before classes. Father testifies that breakfast changed everything students thought about school. A year later in 2005 Rubanda Solidarity officially started with both Nursery and primary sections for both girls and boys, day and boarding and non-discriminatory due either religion, gender, physical disability or even tribe or clan. For years both primary and nursery sections were in one compound but now each is independent.

I thank God who has kept our nursery school steadily growing stronger and providing a great foundation for primary section since 2004 up. I also thank our friends for the generous support they have always given to the school and the entire community. I pray that the Lord God may continue to bless our nursery school. Rubanda Solidarity Nursery school has three classes/grades of Baby (4 years), Middle Class (4 years) and Top Class (5-6 years). Top Class learners normally graduate at the end of the third term. It's always an enjoyable day with parents, friends, and the entire school family.

In addition to that, we have introduced the three School Pillars in our school which are Spiritual, Academic and Life Skills. These pillars are easy for children to understand the purpose for which they come to school. Each child is guided how to identify where his love and passion are so to join that for active participation. Learners love the three pillars so much. Our school is a home any caring family would love his child to be or that of a friend. I encourage parents and guardians to consider bringing your child or reaching out to your friend and neighbor not to miss this God given opportunity for your child.

I can't fail to extend my great appreciation to our directors for the compassion they are putting into the Nursery School and the community. Our Founders tell us that in order for children to receive quality education they must receive basic needs for their daily living. These basic needs include balanced food, safe drinking water, good place for sleeping, health care and disease prevention, required scholastic materials, security, light, God, and life skills. Good child development needs all this in place. Our administration is progressively realizing this. Just to mention, this year our school has upgraded from E-reader to integrated basic computer learning syllabus. In the near future the top class/grade will be introduced to E-readers so the learner starts to know about technology before going into primary one. Our Nursery students love very much rice, avocados, egg plants, local porridge (enkumba) and many others. The reason we have a school garden. Our school nurse is efficient in taking care of our students in collaboration with the Rubanda Primary Health Center III. As we know little children need more health attention. May God bless our Nursery School Forever.



WHY DO WE FIGHT WITH PEOPLE WE LOVE?


THE THREE PILLARS OF OUR SCHOOL OUR ALMA MATER (Rubanda Solidarity Community)
